All income is retained by the Trust to cover the direct costs of providing safe, secure car parking. The Trust makes no profit from the revenue from car parks, but seeks to ensure that car parking is self-financing and doesn't require any subsidy from funds provided for patient care.

How much money was raised from parking fines in each of the last two financial years - 2016/17 and 2017/18?

None.

Have you increased the cost of parking in your car parks during the last financial year - between 2016/17 and 2017/18?

There has not been an increase in the cost levied to patients and visitors; however the cost for staff has risen by RPI.
